



What is Safeguarding?









The responsibility of organisations to make sure their staff, operations, and programmes do no harm to children and adults at-risk nor expose them to abuse or exploitation.

It is becoming good practice to think about how we safeguard everyone in our organisations at all times, including protecting staff from harm and inappropriate behaviour such as bullying and harassment.



Who is a Child?












Who is a Vulnerable Adult?

Whether by force or unequal circumstances









No knowledge of how to report

Feel powerless

Lack of faith in the response

It's not your job to investigate!







How to report: principles

01 TIMING



Report ASAP

Longer it takes to report = more interpretation

02 DETAILS



Investigative Details

Date, Time, location, event, names...

03 INTERPRETATION



Situational Awareness *Facts not judgements*
